### Minister of Works, Nigeria

- Oversees and provides strategic direction for the project.
- Key decision-maker in project management and policy implementation.

### Project Health Control (PHC) Service Team

- **Project Manager:** Responsible for coordinating all project activities and maintaining timelines.
