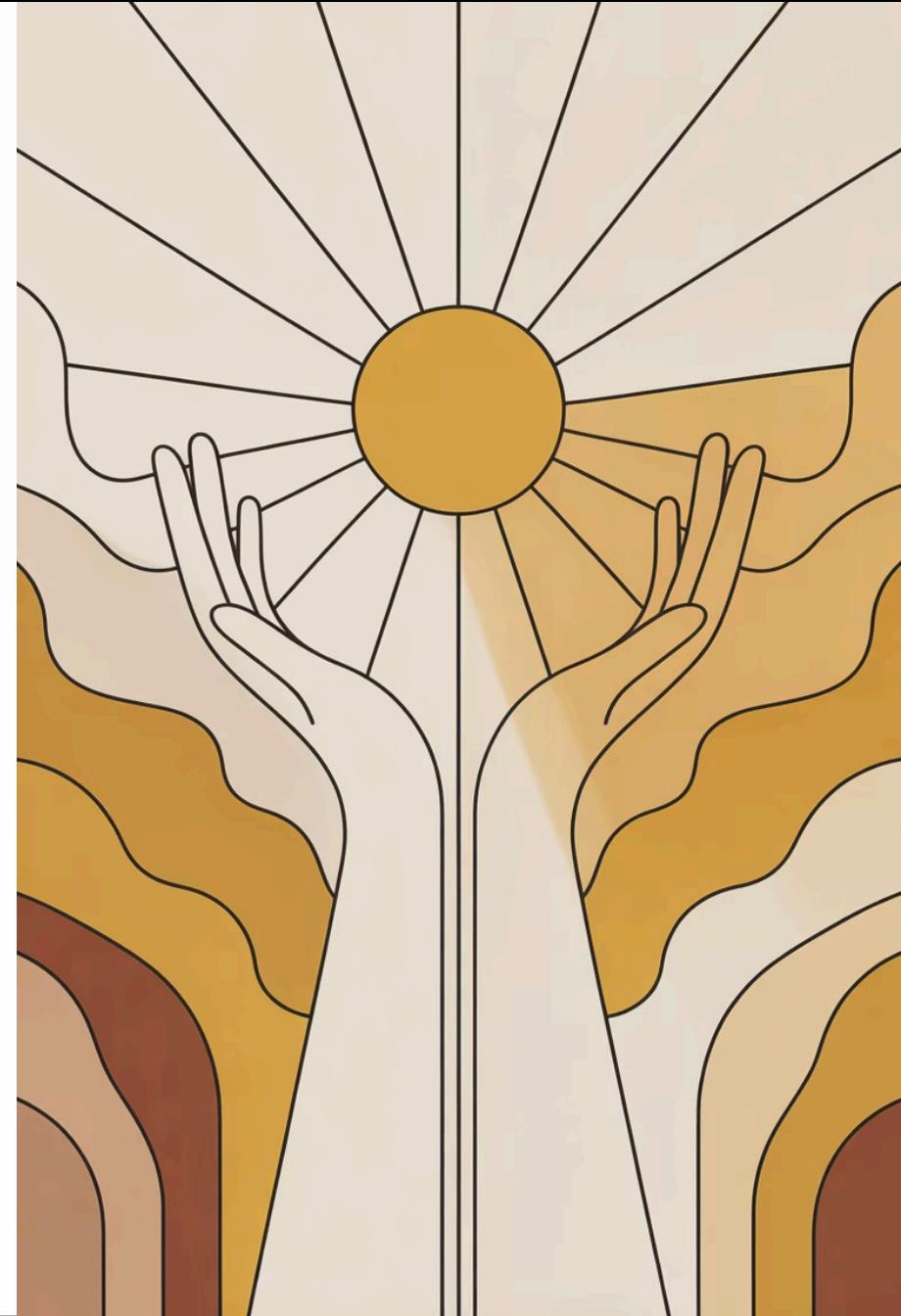

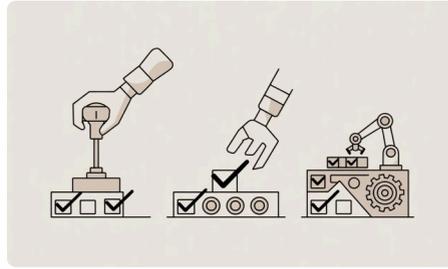

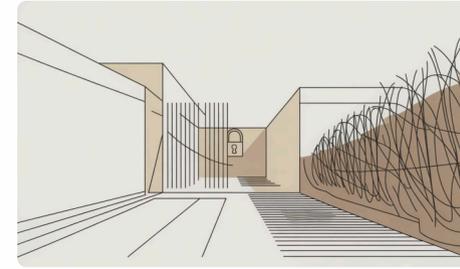
THE CORE CHALLENGE



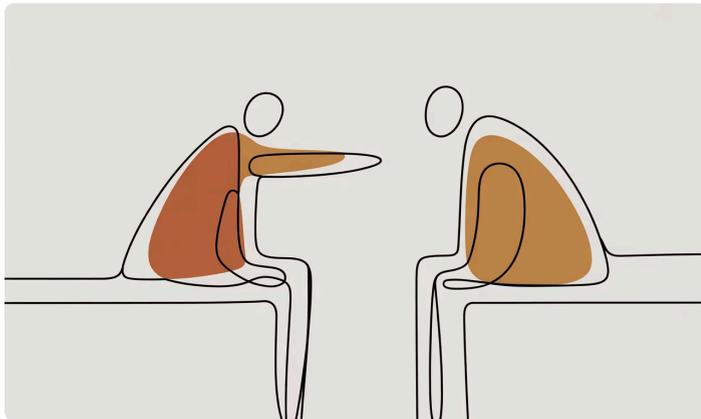
Effort is often invisible

Barriers remain unreported

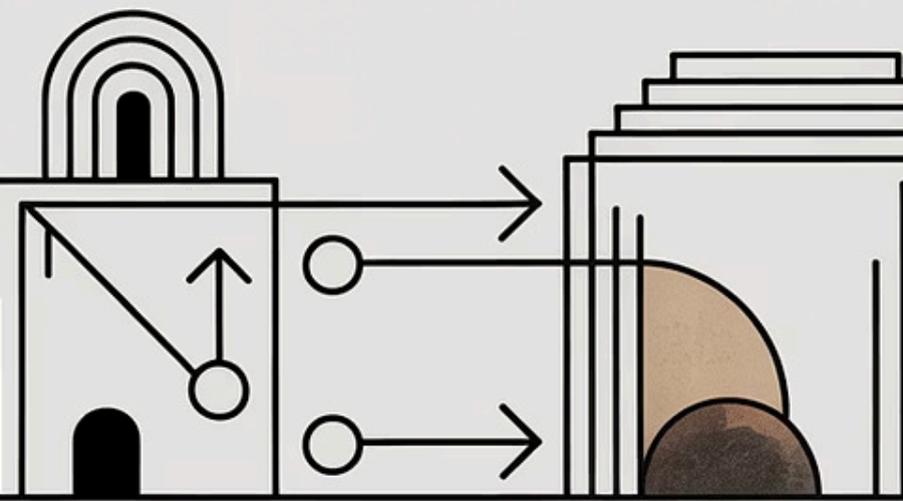


Trust gaps in Jobcentre reviews



No portable weekly record

Universal Credit participants often make genuine efforts, but these efforts remain invisible within current systems. Compliance becomes box-ticking, while real barriers and community contributions go unnoticed. Without a structured weekly record, trust erodes and meaningful support becomes inconsistent.



THE PHC APPROACH

introduces a simple, repeatable weekly logging routine supported by light mentoring. Participants document what they did, what they attempted, what blocked them, and what they plan next. The model is intentionally lightweight and does not require access to DWP systems.

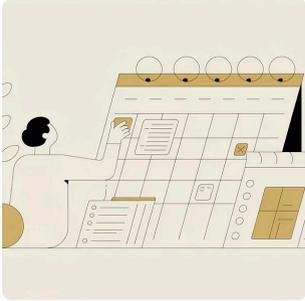

BENEFITS TO PARTICIPANTS

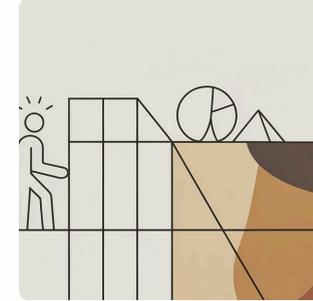
Participants gain clarity, confidence, and a sense of control over their progress. The routine strengthens written expression, encourages early identification of barriers, and builds constructive self-reflection habits. Over time, progress becomes visible and manageable.

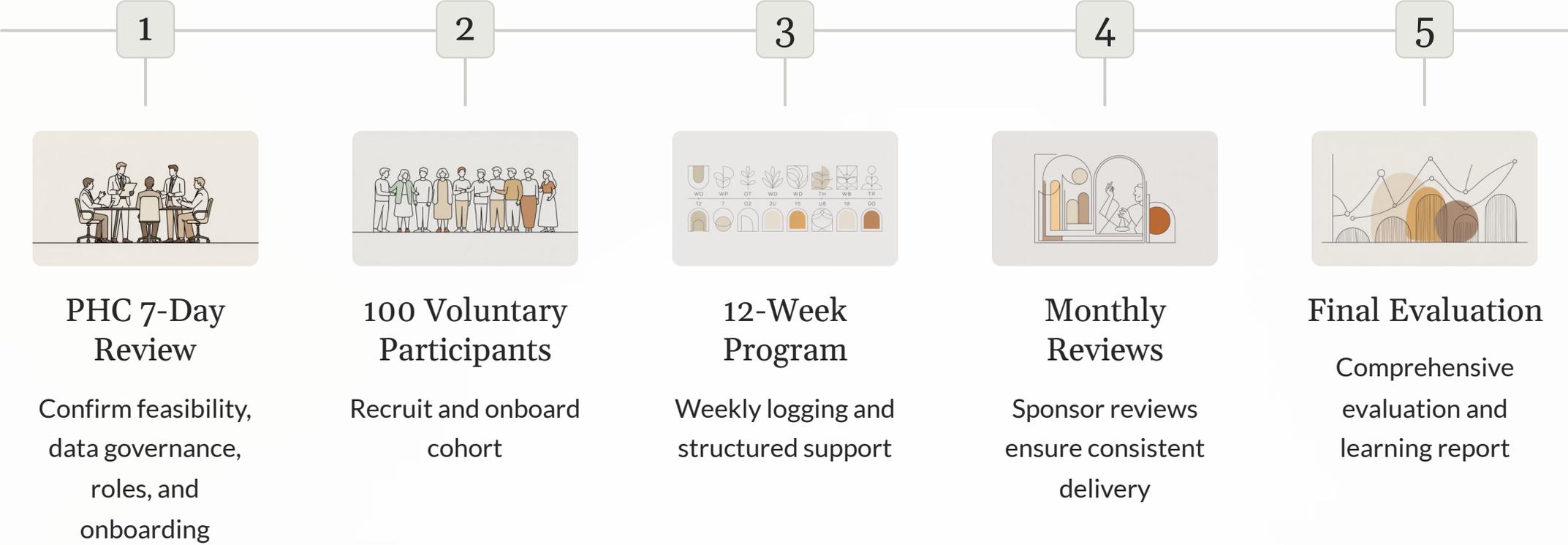

The process is designed for simplicity and accessibility – reducing administrative friction so participants can focus on stability, not paperwork. Unconditional payments go directly to recipients each month with no spending restrictions.

The pilot proposes a 12-week cohort of around 100 voluntary participants.

A structured log of actions, attempts, and plans.



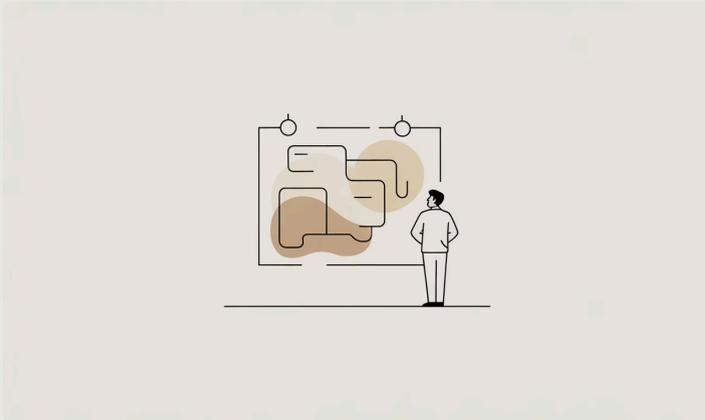

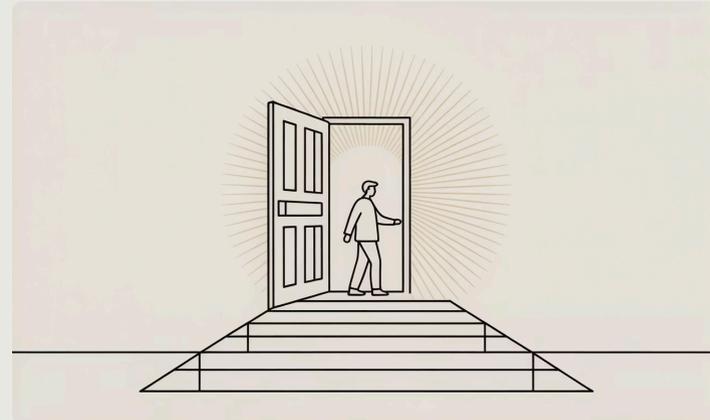

Retention

Participants stay engaged throughout the 12 weeks.



Logging Quality

Weekly records are meaningful, not just completed.



Review Usefulness

Records actively improve Jobcentre conversations.



Participant Feedback

Voices from the cohort shape ongoing delivery.



Barrier Resolution Rate

Tracking how many barriers are identified, addressed and overcome.

Success is measured through retention, logging quality, usefulness in Jobcentre reviews, and participant/sponsor feedback. Additional indicators include barrier resolution rates and readiness for next steps.

OPERATIONAL MODEL



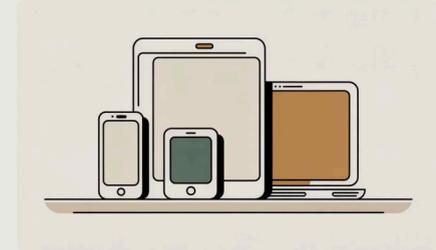
Remote-First Delivery

The pilot runs entirely online, without requiring in-person attendance.



PHC Portal & Dashboards

Participants and sponsors access progress through a shared cloud platform.



Own Devices

Participants use their own devices to log and review progress.



Optional Community Hub

Hub access is available for those without reliable home connectivity.



Hosting & Backups

Order Efficiency Ltd provides hosting, administration, and data backups.



PEOPLE & ROLES

PHC Core Team

Strategists, Analysts, and Admins support delivery throughout.

Trained Mentors

Light-touch guidance provided by trained PHC mentors.

Participants as PHC Guests

Participants join as PHC Guests – not employees or trainees.

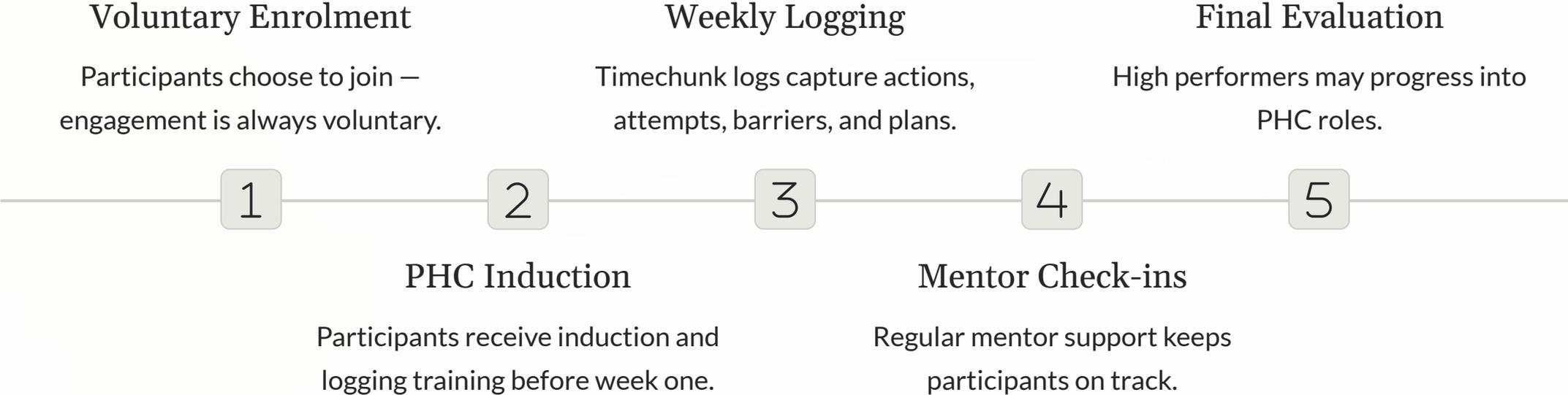
Safeguarding

Safeguarding requirements must be confirmed before delivery begins.

Delivery is supported by PHC Strategists, Analysts, Admins, and trained mentors.

THE JOURNEY

Participants begin with induction and logging training. They complete weekly timechunk logs, receive mentor support, and participate in monthly reviews. The first two weeks are used to tune the process. High performers may progress into PHC roles.





FINANCE MODEL

The pilot costs approximately £200 per participant over 12 weeks, plus PHC delivery costs. Expenses include cloud services, mentoring, admin, onboarding, and reporting. Sponsors may include local authorities, MPs, CSR/ESG budgets, foundations, or philanthropists.

FUTURE VISION

1

Repeatable Cohort Model

A standardised model that can be rolled out across multiple cohorts.

2

Low-Cost Governance

Designed to remain affordable and scalable without heavy overhead.

3

Standardised Outputs

Outputs allow sponsors to compare cohorts and track trends over time.

4

Optional PHC Progression

Strong performers may progress into PHC roles as the programme scales.

5

Policy Learning Potential

DWP remains an observer, with future partnership possible.

OPEN DWP becomes a repeatable, low-cost governance and mentoring service. Standardised outputs allow sponsors to compare cohorts. Participants may progress into PHC roles, and DWP remains an observer unless a future partnership is trialled.

KEY ITEMS

Several decisions must be finalised before launch.



Host & Location

Host organisation and delivery location to be confirmed.



Sponsor & Budget

Sponsor and budget must be agreed before launch.



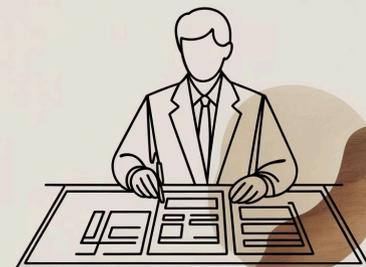
GDPR & Anonymisation

Consent and anonymisation rules must be clearly defined.



Safeguarding Lead

A named safeguarding lead must be confirmed prior to delivery.

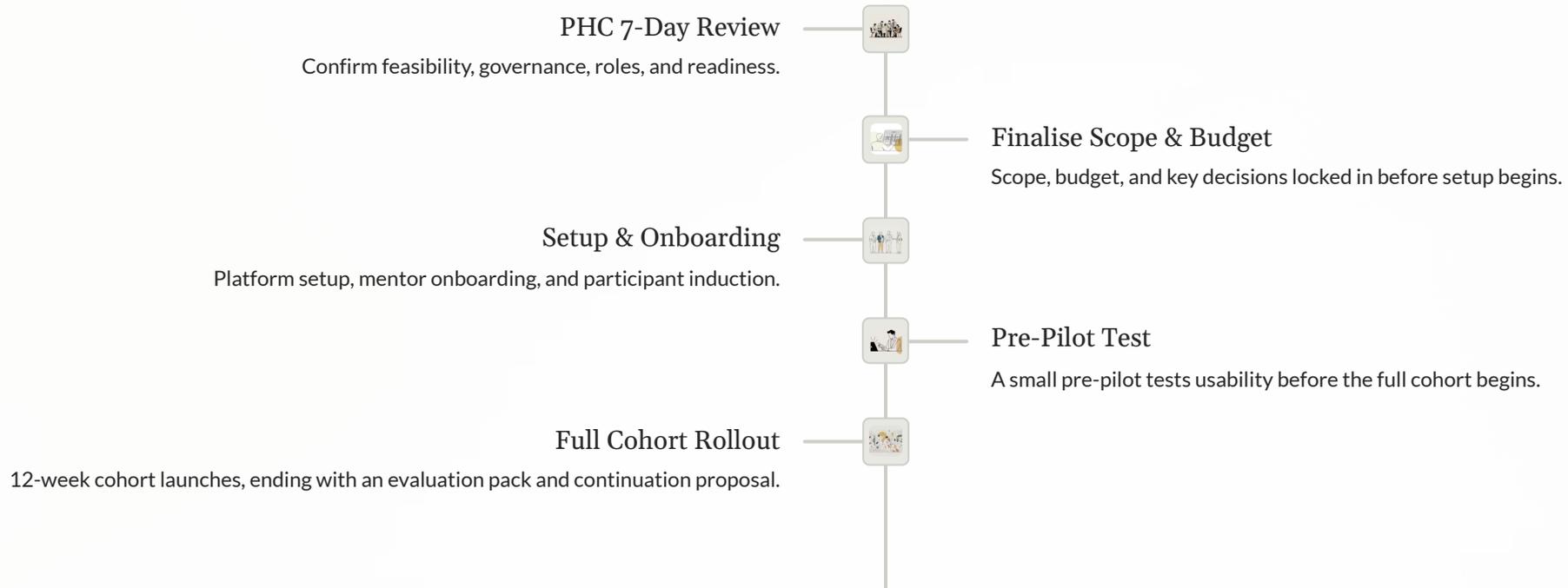


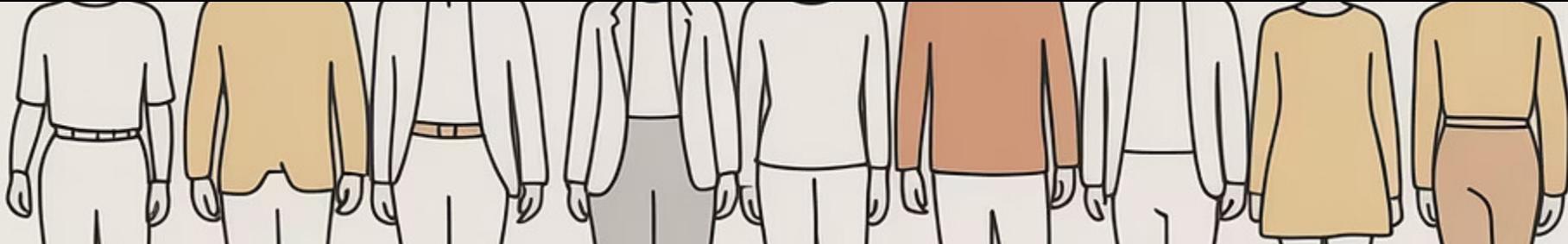
Reporting & Comms

Reporting requirements and communications stance to be agreed.

PATH TO LAUNCH

The launch process begins with the PHC 7-Day Review, followed by scope finalisation, setup, and mentor onboarding. A small pre-pilot tests usability before the full 12-week cohort begins. The pilot ends with an evaluation pack and continuation proposal.





Project Health Control strengthens visibility, confidence, and real progress for Universal Credit participants while giving sponsors a transparent, low-cost model for learning and decision-making. It offers a scalable, community-led pathway for improving outcomes without disrupting DWP systems.
