Restoring Dignity and Shared Responsibility in Welfare



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We've all heard the labels - "scrounger," "waster," "burden on the system." It's easy to judge people when you can't see what they're trying to do.

But what if we could?

What if people on Universal Credit had the tools to **track their contributions**, **show their intentions**, and build **a credible path forward** - *without having to game the system* or endure endless box-ticking exercises? That's the idea behind **OPEN DWP** — *Outreach for People Experiencing Need*, a new, low-cost pilot initiative built around the **Project Health Control (PHC) Service**.

It's simple. It's non-disruptive. And it's long overdue.

What is OPEN DWP?

OPEN DWP doesn't change anyone's benefit status. It doesn't replace DWP systems. And while it does involve a modest cost - around £200 per person over 12 weeks - this is not overhead or waste. It's a targeted investment in each person's future, a structured engagement and a gift of encouragement.

This contribution funds:

- PHC participation and mentoring
- Weekly progress logging
- A clear, helpful record they can bring to Jobcentre reviews

No payroll. No reclassification. Just purposeful participation, and a real sense of forward motion.

Where PHC Comes In

The **PHC Service** was designed for complex infrastructure projects — to track what's working, what's not, and who's doing the work.

But people aren't pipelines. So we've adapted PHC to serve people — using its same **7-day review model**, **risk tracking**, and **participation logs** to support progress for UC claimants in real time. Not just "what did you apply for?" but:

- What challenges are you tackling?
- What's in your local environment that needs doing?
- Who are you helping, and how are they better off?

That's what PHC helps track.

Why Now?

The welfare system isn't broken — it's just **stuck**.

It's stuck in paperwork. It's stuck in suspicion. And it's stuck in a mindset where value is measured only in job offers, not intentions, courage, or community action.

OPEN DWP is an invitation to change that. To create a **low-cost**, **high-trust model** that empowers people, and shows policymakers what's possible.

We've written the proposal. We've structured the pilot. What we need now is a few brave stakeholders - local authorities, MPs, or community leaders - who are willing to test it.
