Dear Sirs,

Thank you for your letter dated 29 July 2025, in which you state:

"We note that you and others have written virtually identical letters."

As the sole author of my correspondence, I must object to this characterisation. I have not submitted any letter that was based on, derived from, or coordinated with others. Accordingly, I would appreciate clarification:

- Could you please identify which of my letters you believe to be "virtually identical" to another?
- Alternatively, if this assertion was made in error or based on an incomplete review, I ask that it be formally corrected.

If I receive no clarification, I will reasonably conclude that your letter was a boilerplate response — distributed indiscriminately, which would be ironic given the accusation.

I remain open to constructive dialogue, but I expect accuracy and good faith in return.


